# Lot 1. Ankh, Egyptian

Circa 550BC. Height  $23 \mathrm{cm} \, [9]$ ; width  $10 \mathrm{cm} \, [4]$  across the arm. Composed of an allow of copper and silver bearing untranslated hieratic markings about the front. Known as the "Blood Ankh".

Minimum bid P100..

# Lot 2. Manuscript of Beth Elohim

Hebrew, by Beth Elohim written circa 1580AD. The pages are illuminated with gold leaf. Leather binding, octavo, 426 pages.

Minimum bid P60.



## Los 3. Multiple Lot

Magician's Cassock, embroidered with various signs of ceremonial magic. Hickory Want, carved with astrological signs. Athame, 31cm [12"] long, double-edged.

Minimum bid P40.

### Lot 4. Hand of Glory

USA circa 1900. The preserved left hand of a human, marked overall with mystic designs. Each finger supports a candle reported made of rendered human fat.

Minimum bid P20.

# Lot 5. Multiple Lot

African Fetish, circa 1800, of teak wood and hair. About 18cm [7"] tall, in the style of the Hausi tribe of western Africa; African Drum, circa 1800, teak wood and skin, irregularly shapy, 41cm [16"] tall. Both bear the sign of the same artisan.

Minimum bid P30.

## Lot 6. Book, The Magus

English by Francis Barret. First edition, 1801, Lackington, Allen & Co, Publishers.

Minimum bid P50.



## Lot 7. Sword

German, circa 1350. First belonging to the alchemist and sorcerer Paracelsus, it is  $108 \text{cm} \left[42^n\right] \log$  with a pommel engraved with the word "AZOTH". Minimum bid P250.

## Lot 8. Skull, Human

Circa 1500. Used during black masses. Top of skull removed and interior inlaid with silver to form cup. Rim surrounded by 13 garnets.

Minimum bid P100.

#### Lot 9. Riveted Brass Head

Germany 13th century. Artisan unknown. Similar to the "Philosopher's head." Minimum bid P130.

## Lot 10. I-Ching Sticks

China, second ming dynasy. Carved ivory, six sticks used to cast the I-Ching, each 15.5cm [6"] long and 40mm [1/4"] square. Minimum bid P70.


# Lot 11. Brooch of St-Christopher

France, 12th century. Bears inscription "Regarde St-Christophe et va rassure".



## Lot 12. Book, Book of the Law

English, by Aleister Crowley, published 1904. Minimum bid P10.



## Lot 13. Book, Prodigies in the New-England Canaan

English, by Rev. Ward Phillips.Colonial US. 18th Century. Minimum bid P55.


## Lot 14. Multiple Lot

Four medallions: two gold, one copper, one tin. France circa 1600. Protective signs to be worn by sorcerer during various magical operations.

Minimum bid P45.

### Lot 15. Book, Dictionnaire Infernal

French, by Jacques Collin de Plancy, reprint, 1863 by Plon. Minimum bid P18.



Lot 16. Shaman Medecine Bag

Eskimo (Canada), modern, leather. Minimum bid P45.

## Lot 17. Gold Ring

Arabia, 19th Century. A design of intertwined serpents surround a magical symbol evidently meant to be a Seal of Solomon.

Minimum bid P35.
